

Commercial Bank marks World Disabled Week



The Commercial Bank of Ceylon recently hosted a special program for the residents of Cheshire Home for the differently-abled. This program was organized by the Corporate Social Responsibility Trust of the Bank to commemorate World Disabled Week.
