

Golden Gate Pendulum Service Of MSC Returns To Jaya Container Terminal



The Golden Gate Pendulum Service owned by the Geneva-based Mediterranean Shipping Company (MSC) commenced patronising Jaya Container Terminal (JCT) of Sri Lanka Ports Authority (SLPA) on a weekly basis expecting more than 1800 moves per vessel.
