

How Competitive Is Sri Lanka For Business?

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The latest issue of The Global Competitiveness Report, published by the World Economic Forum, was released. In assessing the competitiveness of countries, this report includes The Global Competitiveness Index featuring the 12 pillars of competitiveness, The Business Competitiveness Index, detailed country profiles and data tables covering more than 100 social and economic indicators. This year a record 131 economies worldwide were polled.
