Indian Housing Project Extends To Matara

IFRC/SLRC is the implementing agency for the houses being constructed at Indola Estate.

Out of the 14,000 houses committed by the Government of India in the plantation areas, over 1,000 houses have been completed and construction of 3,000 is currently underway.
