

Lanka Bell reaches 100,000 CDMA lines

Lanka Bell, the first private fixed telecom operator to launch CDMA (Code Division Multiple Access) technology in Sri Lanka announced it had sold its 00,000th CDMA line to D M Jayasundera of the Bandarawela branch. To celebrate this landmark achievement, the management of Lanka Bell gifted both the CDMA phone and connection to Jayasundera free of charge.

The company has also gone on record as being the first-ever operator to give "blanket CDMA coverage" to the Colombo and Greater Colombo areas, and to connect the entire Tsunami-ravaged South.
