

# **Mobitel Beats World-Wide Competition At Awards Hosted By Kevin Spacey**



Mobitel scooped the prize for best operator in the MOFILM 2009 awards, hosted by double Academy Award-winning actor Kevin Spacey, amidst worldwide competition.

This is a significant achievement for Mobitel and Sri Lanka as GSMA Mobile World Congress is the largest gathering and exhibition for the mobile industry where a congress featuring prominent Chief Executives representing mobile operators, vendors and content owners from across the world are present. This was the first time ever that an operator was recognised for the MOFILM Best Mobile Operator award.

Kevin Spacey commented: "MOFILM to me, is another step in that ability for people all over the world who can now, with technology, make a movie, cut it on their computer, upload it and have an audience be able to see it," he said.

The actor said that any genre of short film played well on mobiles and that the idea was to give viewers access to content whenever they wanted. "Any time we try to put a parenthesis around something, with respect to artistic inspiration, somebody comes along and breaks the rules and before we know it, something we thought couldn't work will work," he said.

MOFILMS are short films typically dedicated to raising awareness of current social issues in a fast paced fashion. The short films are played-back on mobile devices, now considered the fourth medium of entertainment following cinema, TV and the computer.

Mobitel partnered with the University of Moratuwa to conduct extensive research on the present and future of MOFILM and introduced Mobile Short Film as part of the overall curriculum under the subject Video Production. This area of study is gaining overwhelming popularity among undergraduate students.

Sri Lanka Rupavahini Corporation, collaborated with Mobitel to produce several professional video clips suited for the Mobile Screen format. One of the clips "A friend in need" directed by Chandana Senevirathne was among the five finalists in the drama category at the Film Festival.
