

# Mobitel Offers Upahara To The Ministry Of Environment And Natural Resources

The Sri Lanka State Trading Corporation in partnership with the National Mobile Services Provider Sri Lanka Telecom Mobitel formally handed over the Upahara package along with the first SIM card as part of a national endeavour in bringing unparalleled economic benefits to the state sector and pensioners to the Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources.

Under the initiative of taking forward President Mahinda Rajapakasa's 'Mahinda Chinthanaya' programme, the widely popular and revolutionary Upahara communication package was formally presented to Patali Champika Ranawaka,

Sri Lanka Telecom Mobitel, the National Mobile Services Provider, is a wholly owned subsidiary of Sri Lanka Telecom. In January 2004, the company launched its full-fledged 2.5G GSM network that is EDGE/GPRS enabled and designed to operate on dual band. In December 2007 the company launched its 3.5G HSPA network, which was the first Super 3.5G network in South Asia. Investments committed to date in its 3.5G/2.5G networks and service offering totals over US\$ 300 mn and are set to increase its base stations to 2000 by the end the first quarter of 2009.
