With scanning speeds as low as 0.35 seconds, the system is capable of capturing the entire heart over a single heartbeat to include complete functional diagnosis while its 640 slice technology helps obtain the highest levels of detail from a single scan.

Its ability to review moving joint structures in 3D provides new clinical applications for orthopaedic imaging. The system is also ideal for a wide array of diagnostic measurements.
