
Pathfinder Foundation Presents Sinhala Translation of 'The India Way' to Dr. S. Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister of India

First published by Harper Collins Publishers India, The India Way offers an indepth analysis of the geopolitical shifts triggered by the 2008 Global Financial Crisis and the 2020 Coronavirus pandemic. Dr. Jaishankar, a seasoned diplomat and India's External Affairs Minister draws from India's rich civilisational history to articulate how the country is navigating itself as a rising global power in an increasingly complex and unpredictable world.
