The Shrama Harasara initiative rewards those opening new PFCAs with benefits, highlighting the contributions of Sri Lankans abroad to the economy.

The Sanwathsara Pranama promotion will award 64 random winners with essential goods bags worth 15,000 rupees each for receiving workers' remittances. The Doo Daru Pranama initiative in October encourages minors to open "Ethera Udana" accounts, with two winners from each branch receiving school equipment worth 5,000 rupees each.
