The Kandy Municipal Council (KMC) introduced a Quick Response Code (QR Code). Through this in-house developed QR Code, KMC expects to engage the public living within the Municipal limits and those visiting the city daily to channel their general complaints/ suggestions in real time. At the request of the KMC, the Kandy Branch of People's Leasing and Finance sponsored 15,000 QR Code stickers. It will be displayed in food outlets and

other public places in Kandy.

We also give back to society through Social Welfare programs. As we learned from KMU, this is the first time that a Sri Lankan provincial governance institution has introduced a QR Code to receive real-time responses from the public.
