Army women emerged as champions, and Ananda College bagged the boys' title while Ladies' College secured the ladies' championship.

The event witnessed tough competition, where schools such as Royal College, Asian International School, and Gateway College showcased dominant skills.

In the men's events, rowers from Air Force, Navy, and Colombo Rowing Club did well to finish among the top three. During the first day of the tournament, over 45 races were conducted. On the second day, 31 final races were concluded.
