

Tokyo Cement Boosts Capacity with High-Tech One-Million-Ton Plant in Trincomalee

Sunil Handunnetti, the Minister of Industry and Entrepreneurship Development, inaugurated Tokyo Cement Group's state-of-the-art cement manufacturing plant in

Trincomalee. This fully automated, high-tech grinding facility adds one million metric tons to Tokyo Cement's total production capacity, increasing it to four million metric tons per annum, making it the largest in the country.
