The sixth National Safety Award ceremony was held recently with Athauda Seneviratne, Minister of Labour Relations and Foreign Employment, gracing the event as chief guest. It was evolved and is sponsored by Eagle.

The competition is conducted in three categories – Large, Medium and Small.
